Soul Survivors Fund Information for Grant Applicants

Purpose

The purpose of the Soul Survivors Fund, a Field of Interest Fund of the Baton Rouge Area Foundation, is to create breast cancer awareness and provide access and opportunities for early detection to help save lives of women, particularly women in underserved communities who lack access to proper healthcare, screenings and other diagnostic testing. An advisory committee meets on a semiannual basis to review grant requests from organizations whose programs support breast cancer awareness and early detection.

Grant Procedure

Organizations applying for grants should include the following information in their proposals.

Proposal Summary: Every application must include a typed summary which provides the following information, in the following order:

- Organization name
- Executive Director
- Brief summary of the project (50 words or less)
- Project director
- Address
- Phone number
- Compelling reason for the project (50 words or less)
- Amount requested
- Area of interest
- Mission statement
- Service area

Narrative Section: The application should be concise and should include the following information:

- Concise history of the organization with an overview of current programs and activities.
- Description of the challenge to be met by the project.
- Detailed description of the project, including strategies, measurable objectives and a timetable.
- Plan for continuing the project once the Foundation's funding ends. Plan for evaluating the project.

Attachments: Attachments should include the following information and should be no longer than ten pages:

- Names and qualifications of persons responsible for carrying out the program.
- Detailed project budget and budget narrative, including income sources and expenditures, as well as a list of other requests for funding, including those pending or approved.
- A list of the organization's board members including the board members' principal occupations, a description of the term of office and the rotation schedule for the board.
- Financial statements, including the organization's operating budget, balance sheet and statements of support, revenue and expenses for the last completed and current fiscal year.
- Statement from the organization's board of directors authorizing the request and agreeing to implement the project if funded.
- Copy of the Internal Revenue Service notice stating that the organization is tax-exempt or a copy of the organization's fiscal agent's 501(c)(3) with a letter from that organization stating its willingness to serve.

Applicants should submit their completed proposal (including supporting material), without stapling or binding, to:

Grantmaking Schedule

Grant requests should be received by 5:00 pm (4:00 pm on Fridays) on the deadline date. If the deadline falls on a weekend or holiday, requests are due on the weekday immediately preceding that weekend or holiday. The deadline and notification dates are:

Application Deadlines:

February 1, September 1

Notification Dates:

March 1, October 1

Reporting Requirement

If a grant is awarded, the Foundation requires that the funded organization submit both fiscal accounting and narrative reports on the use of its grant and the impact that the grant may have had on the community it serves. Reporting guidelines will be established in the letter of award.
